Tackling violence

Havering Council has announced a three-year plan to tackle violence against women and girls in the borough.

The plan includes a programme to spot the early signs of domestic violence against women and girls; take action to prevent, protect and support women and girls who are being abused; and ensure that the police are supported in using their powers to full effect so that they can take effective action against offenders.

Havering Council has also approved plans to tackle serious violence and knife crime in the borough. The Serious Group Violence and Knife Crime Strategy aims to reduce the number of young people getting involved in knife crime and serious violence. A three-year action plan aims to de-glamourise the culture associated with serious youth violence and will also seek to stop young people from carrying knives and to help them find alternatives to being in a gang.

Keep our Community Tidy

On our regular walkabout, we often notice litter that has either been blown along the streets during the windy weather conditions or more annoyingly having been left or dropped there by uncaring passers-by or commuters. Most of the time, we just pick the rubbish up and dispose of it. However, recently we did have to contact the Council's Streetcare team, to request a full litter pick due to unsightly rubbish that had been thrown into bushes and shrub area of a residential building. If you see litter around your property please pick it up and dispose of it as this will help to keep our community litter free.

Havering Council, have launched a new campaign and invested an extra £400,000 into Streetcare services, which will see residential street cleaning increased from every three weeks to every fortnight. So please let us all do our bit to help keep our community clean and tidy.

Extra Police patrols needed?



Police resources are still considered too low generally and the community are demanding for more police officers to be made available on the streets. Extra police are obviously needed to combat Crime, but any additional police will only be deployed to the areas where the Police consider them necessary and, will only prioritise their regular patrols, based upon the number of crimes that are being reported. Therefore, it is vital that anyone who has been a victim of crime or has any information about a crime taking place, should report it to the Police through the correct reporting channels. By doing this it will result in more accurate statistics for crimes that have taken place in our area.

To report a crime you can do so via the Metropolitan Police Website on www. met.police.uk or in a non-emergency you can call 101. For an emergency please call 999. If you would like to report a crime anonymously you can do this via the crime stoppers website which is www.crimestoppers-uk.org or call 0800 555 111. Putting Harold Wood On The Map



Coming across a 1777 map of the district, I looked vainly for Harold Wood. The location consisted of fewer than a dozen houses shown, some of them familiar names; Owletts, Gubbins, New Hall, Redden Ct. and one near Brinsmead Rd. They obviously employed labour, but no cottages were indicated, so perhaps it was casual labour that came from outside the area. With Romford and Hornchurch each having a population around 1000,

Harold Wood, which was part of North Ward, Hornchurch, numbered only 50 or so residents, presumably the land owners. A far cry from today's 12,000+, who could all enjoy this Bulletin if we had more volunteers for delivering.

New SEN school for Havering



Plans to build a new £8.5 million free school for children with special educational needs (SEN) have been approved by Havering Council.

The new school is being planned on the St Edward's Church of England Academy site in London Road, Romford, and will cater for 60 children aged three to 16 years

The purpose-built school will be run by the Samuel Ward Academy Trust, now known as Unity Schools Partnership Trust, which currently runs St Edward's and will support children who have a statement or education health care plan.

The new school will take the pressure off the existing three special educational needs schools within the borough and will significantly reduce the cost of sending pupils to schools outside of the borough, while ensuring children receive the specialist help they need. The new school will also create additional jobs in the borough with the recruitment of specialist teaching and support staff. The new school will be opened in 2022.

We are glad to see this opening as this is one of the key items that we have been discussing and pursuing with the Council to ensure that there is more provision with Special Educational Needs within the borough.
