If you have trees, bushes or shrubs that are overhanging from your front garden on to the public highway would you please be kind enough to cut them back as this could impede our residents and be potentially dangerous to disabled people, elderly and children especially in pushchairs. If items get reported to the local authority then they must take up the complaint and they then check the offending property. The Council will give a time limit for the offending overhanging foliage to be cut by the house-owner and if this is not carried out they will notify the residents that they will deal with the situation and the house-owner will be charged.

#### Avoid the queue

Gerpins Lane Reuse and Recycling Centre in Upminster, run by the East London Waste Authority is back in operation. It has been heavily used, and queues had have exceeded two hours at times.

#### **Condolences**

To the family, friends and church members following the news that Fr. Dr Bijir Marlowe Chirathilattu who died after testing positive for the Coronavirus. He was the past priest at St Thomas's Church in Taunton Road, Harold Hill and he served the Community well.

#### **Spotting signs**

If you have noticed a loss of, or change in, your smell or taste then this may be a sign that you have coronavirus.

These symptoms are added to those previously identified of a new continuous cough or a fever.

Anyone experiencing any of these coronavirus red flags, including health and social care workers, should now self-isolate for seven days to reduce the risk of spreading the infection.

The household of anyone with these symptoms should also self-isolate for 14 days.

If the symptomatic person lives with others, they should stay at home for seven days, while all other household members should stay home for 14 days even if they do not have symptoms.

Not everyone has the same symptoms of coronavirus. Some people may lose their sense of smell or taste with or without having a fever and cough as other symptoms of COVID-19.

Everyone who is showing coronavirus symptoms is now eligible to book a swab test to find out if they have the virus. More details on the government's website.

#### Use sensibly, if necessary

In line with government advice, everyone who can work from home should continue to do so.

Public transport should be avoided, wherever possible, to free up the limited space available to those who have no alternative way to travel.

If you must travel, please plan ahead and travel outside of the busiest times, particularly first thing in the morning.

The busiest times on the network are 5.45 to 8.15 in the morning, and 4 to 5.30 in the afternoon. Transport for London (TfL) are asking Londoners to travel outside these times if they possibly can.

TfL has produced a list of the <u>busiest times and places</u> on their tube and rail network. This list and the busiest times might change over time.

TfL has also updated its digital tools such as <u>journey planner</u>, and the real-time data they provide to third party apps.

Please maintain social distancing of two metres wherever possible if using the transport network, wear a face covering and respect the space of fellow passengers to help maintain this distance.

Do not travel if you have any symptoms of COVID-19.

#### Back up and running

As a result of additional funding provided by Havering Council, the local Citizens Advice Bureau (CAB) is able to provide staff and volunteers with equipment to enable them to work from home and re-start the telephone advice service for residents.

CAB hope the telephone advice service will enable local people to get the information and advice they need in these difficult times.

#### Be aware

Don't forget that if you are planning on travelling into central London that the Congestion Charge has now been reintroduced.

The £11.50 a day charge is now applied between 7am and 10pm, seven days a week, instead of just weekdays. This charge will rise to £15 from 22 June.

The ultra-low emission zone which costs £12.50 for most vehicles that don't meet the emissions threshold, has also been reintroduced.

#### **National Autisitic School Chigwell**

I was saddened to hear that the National Autistic Society have decided to close the Andersen School in Chigwell which supported over 50 families with 6 of them coming from Havering. I have written to the NAS Chief Executive and expressing my concerns over the closure as it acts as a vital resource for individuals with Autism and this will leave a gap for many families across the borough and elsewhere. The Chief Executive has told me that "the school has struggled to reach and maintain standards since it opened and, despite hard work by staff at the school with support from our charity, we have not managed to turn the school around". This has been confirmed by the NAS own reviews into the school and by recent Ofsted inspections.

I have also been in touch with the Havering SEN department over this and of the 6 children that remain at the school 2 were already planning to leave this summer, and of the 4 remaining, the Council are working closely with the families to discuss what educational provision can be offered from September. There is a campaign locally to try and get the NAS Trustees to reverse this decision and there is a petition on Change.org which I would urge you all to sign. #### Reopening business - government charter for working during COVID-19

On 10 May the government has announced their Recovery Strategy for bringing the country out of lockdown from the COVID-19 pandemic.

The government has produced a Charter, in partnership with the Home Building Federation, for safer working practices whilst COVID-19 remains prevalent.

#### 1: Carry out a COVID-19 risk assessment

Before restarting work you should ensure the safety of the workplace by:

- carrying out a risk assessment in line with the HSE guidance
- consulting with your workers or trade unions
- sharing the results of the risk assessment with your workforce and on your website

#### 2: Develop cleaning, handwashing and hygiene procedures

You should increase the frequency of handwashing and surface cleaning by:

- encouraging people to follow the guidance on hand washing and hygiene
- providing hand sanitiser around the workplace, in addition to washrooms
- frequently cleaning and disinfecting objects and surfaces that are touched regularly
- enhancing cleaning for busy areas
- setting clear use and cleaning guidance for toilets
- providing hand drying facilities either paper towels or electrical dryers

#### 3: Help people to work from home

You should take all reasonable steps to help people work from home by:

- discussing home working arrangements
- ensuring they have the right equipment, for example remote access to work systems

- including them in all necessary communications
- looking after their physical and mental wellbeing

#### 4: Maintain 2m social distancing, where possible


Where possible, you should maintain 2m between people by:

- putting up signs to remind workers and visitors of social distancing guidance
- avoiding sharing workstations
- using floor tape or paint to mark areas to help people keep to a 2m distance
- arranging one-way traffic through the workplace if possible
- switching to seeing visitors by appointment only if possible

#### 5: Where people cannot be 2m apart, manage transmission risk

Where it's not possible for people to be 2m apart, you should do everything practical to manage the transmission risk by:

- considering whether an activity needs to continue for the business to operate
- keeping the activity time involved as short as possible
- using screens or barriers to separate people from each other
- using back-to-back or side-to-side working whenever possible
- staggering arrival and departure times
- reducing the number of people each person has contact with by using 'fixed teams or partnering'
