LIFE on MARS

Recently, the Guardian newspaper celebrated its bicentenary and displayed a reproduction of the 1st issue. I noticed the price then was 7d, which would be about £2 today, slightly cheaper than the current price. I find it dangerous to do price comparisons, yet am always doing it. My father earned about £2.25 a week in the thirties, yet managed to get a mortgage and paid about £2.25 a month repayments. In 1953, I too got a monthly mortgage of £9.50 equal to my weekly salary. It doesn't seem such a millstone now, looking at the situation today.

At my Great-arandson's 7th birthday I noticed the expensive looking electronic presents and tried to recall my childhood gifts in the Thirties. They wouldn't have been electronic, we didn't have mains electric. If it didn't run on gas we didn't have it (Dad worked for the Gas Company). Our wireless ran on an HT 120v battery and a 6volt accumulator that regularly needed recharging. My favourite present was a 7-volume set of Newnes Pictorial Knowledge bought from a tally man on the door step for seven guineas. It served me through my childhood and I still have it. It reads so dated now with Baird demonstrating his new TV system and the building of the yet unnamed Queen Mary liner. Thinking back, Dad spent almost a month's wages on that present! Another non electric one was Devil amongst the Tailors, a skittle game with a diamond shaped array of pins on a board that could be flattened by a swung ball on a string anchored to a rod above the table. The only clever bit was a handle that when yanked, reset the pins for a new game. These gifts kept me content for the whole of the thirties. Something similar today is on sale for at least £100. Dad couldn't have paid more than £2 or £3 pounds then.

I often compare the cost of things by referring to the price of the Mars bar. I bought a Mars Bar recently at 60p The first thing I noticed was it's only about two thirds the size of my pre war 1p Mars bar, so it can no longer be a reliable cost of living indicator. The trouble is I'm running out of contemporaries to tut-tut over today's prices, so I'll have to stop going on about how it was in my day.
